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ON THE COVER No, it's not poison ivy, but it is a weed. It is purported to be the first plant used to create fabric. George Washington and Thomas Jefferson grew one species as a cash crop. Henry Ford constructed a car of its resin-stiffened fiber, and even ran the car on ethanol made from the plant. It even has its own journal (*High Times*). We are, of course, talking about *cannabis*, also known as hemp and marijuana.
