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**ON THE COVER** Patrick Bossuyt. Patrick Bossuyt is best known for his work in developing the Standards for Reporting Diagnostic Accuracy (STARD) guidelines, which are supported by more than 200 journals. Yet, the road that brought Bossuyt and diagnostic studies together was far from a

straight one. Rather than selecting medicine as a career path, psychology appealed to him. Influenced by two young Israelis (one of whom was subsequently awarded the Nobel Prize in economics), Bossuyt became interested in judgment and decision-making, a theme that carried over to his own graduate studies in devising techniques to identify patterns in the way people make decisions. How did an introvert who could easily have been a novelist rather than a scientist become Chair of the Department of Clinical Epidemiology, Biostatistics and Bioinformatics at the University of Amsterdam?
